FELICE PIER CARLO IOVINO was born in Pavia on 24 November 1962, graduated in Law at the University of Naples on 24 June 1987. At the same university, he specialised in Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure Law on 26 October 1991 and became scholarship holder at this faculty between 1989 and 1991. Since 17 September 1997, he has been an university researcher at the Faculty of Law of the University of Salerno at the Department of General Public Law, Criminal Procedure Section, for the disciplinary scientific field N16X - Criminal Procedure Law. Confirmed in the role of researcher from 23 September 2000 until 22 May 2001, he was appointed on 1 November 2011 as **Associate Professor for the IUS/16 field (Criminal Procedure Law)**; he has been **in charge of teaching Penitentiary Law**

since 2004. He is author of different publications, including: “L’introduzione della semilibertà nell’ordinamento penitenziario”, 2008; “La liberazione anticipata”, 2006; “Contributo allo studio del procedimento di sorveglianza”, 1995. Among the main research projects of which he was or is responsible: “La tutela della salute in ambito penitenziario” (Health Protection in the Prison Context), “La mediazione penale e l’esecuzione della pena” (Criminal Mediation and Enforcement of Sentences), “Il sovraffollamento penitenziario ed il “piano carceri” (Overcrowded Prisons and the ‘Prisons Plan’).
