## Keynote Speakers



ANJA MATWIJKIW (Ph.D., University of Cambridge, England & Mag.Art., University of Copenhagen, Denmark) is Professor of Ethics & Human Rights at the Indiana University Graduate School & Department of Philosophy, Indiana University Northwest; and an Affiliated Faculty at the Institute for European Studies, IU Bloomington, USA. In addition, Professor Anja Matwijkiw is a former VicePresident of the Shared Ethics Advisory Commission (SEAC) for Northwest Indiana. In this capacity, she worked to promote accountability in local government. Professor Matwijkiw is on the Editorial Boards, International Advisory Boards and Scientific Committees for various journals and presses. These include the GLOBAL COMMUNITY YEARBOOK OF INTERNATIONAL LAW **AND JURISPRUDENCE** (Oxford University

**CRIMINAL** LAW Nijhoff), JOURNAL INTERNATIONAL **REVIEW** (Brill INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL LAW, INTERNATIONAL STUDIES JOURNAL, and EUWEB LEGAL ESSAYS. GLOBAL & INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVES. Professor Matwijkiw's interdisciplinary expertise draws from the theoretical foundations and methodologies of law, disciplines in the social sciences and the humanities, first and foremost philosophy (of law), ethics, and political thought. Together with Dr. Bronik Matwijkiw, she developed the position called Stakeholder Jurisprudence. She has authored or co-authored over seventy pieces of work. These include books, edited volumes and special issues for journals together with articles in top tier journals, such as INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF APPLIED PHILOSOPHY. In the past, Professor Anja Matwijkiw has served as a Carlsberg Research Fellow and Researcher at Lucy Cavendish College, University of Cambridge (1990-1995); a Visiting Lecturer at the Human Rights Program, University of Chicago, where she was also a Faculty Advisor for M.A. students at the Center for International Studies (2000-2003); a Visiting Researcher at Copenhagen Law School and recipient of the New Frontiers in the Arts & Humanities, IU Bloomington (2016-2017). She then went on to be awarded the prestigious Fulbright Distinguished Chair of Public International Law, Raoul Wallenberg Institute of Human Rights and Humanitarian Law & Faculty of Law, Lund University, Sweden (2019-2020). 2022, she was among the "national and international legal experts" who was invited to contribute to the Jean Monnet Module EU-Western Balkans Cooperation on Justice and Home Affairs at the University of Salerno, Italy. In 2020, she joined a research programme in Colombia on Corruption Associated with Transnational Crime (TOC) as Chair of the U.S. working Group. Furthermore, in 2021, she secured an affiliation as a Visiting Researcher at the Faculty of Law at the University of Zagreb, Croatia. Her research has been cited in documents on international principles, e.g., THE LEXINGTON PRINCIPLES ON THE RIGHTS OF DETAINEES (2009). Professor Matwijkiw also authored ethics recommendations for the United Nations as a participant in the first global post-WWII study on transitional justice. This was directed by M. Cherif Bassiouni and co-sponsored by the EuropeAid Office of the European Commission under the auspices of the International Institute of Higher Studies in Criminal Sciences, Italy, 2008-2010). Very recently, the interdisciplinary profile of Professor Matwijkiw's research activities also resulted in a 2022 invitation to become a Center & Program Faculty Affiliate at the Illinois Global Institute.
