VIRGINIE MERCIER is Full Professor of Economic Environmental Law and Member of Economic Law Center (UR 4224) of the Faculty of Law and Political Science at Aix Marseille University (France). Director of the Institute of Environmental Law and sustainable development (IDEDD) since 2009, she organizes "Encounters on economic environmental law" every year. As evidenced by her participation in numerous conferences and publications, her research area mainly concerns the environmental obligations of corporate companies, social responsibility environmental civil liability, socially responsible investment (SRI), and sustainable finance development.

She has also developed a scientific and educational partnership between the Institute of Environmental Law and Sustainable Development and the Center for Business Law and International Trade of the University of Montreal. She also directs the Professional Master "banking law and wealth management" as well as the University diploma "Corporate Social Responsibility", and the **Summer school "sustainable business law and practice - European approach"**, in partnership with the University of Montreal. Each year, this training welcomes around twenty Quebec students selected and benefiting from a scholarship from the University of Montreal, as well as French students, doctoral students and professionals from the right. Since 2019 she presides the "RSE Eloquence" competition, organized in partnership with the University of Haute Alsace, which invites law students from different French universities organized by teams to present an expertise on a given subject related to CSR.
